Xi Jinping

June 13

Xi set off for Latin America.

Will attend BRICS summit in Brazil and visit Argentina, Venezuela and Cuba.

Xi stopped in Rhodes, Greece on his way to Brazil.

Interesting choice. Li Keqiang just in Greece a few weeks ago. Bilateral relations looking very strong, China investing a lot in Greece, most notably through Piraeus Port acquisition. Trying to use Greece as trade bridgehead into Europe?

Xi met with Prime Minister of Greece Antonis Samaras.

Xi met with Greek President Karolos Papoulias.

June 11 Xi participated in a Central Military Commission ceremony to promote four officers the rank of general.

All four said to be Xi's people. Xi is clearly trying to get control of the military and clean it up. I'd expect purge of Xu Caihou is just beginning of larger crackdown on corruption in military.

According to Xinhua, Xi said one cannot help thinking of China's modern history when the country was so weak and destitute that it was for everyone to bully. Foreign aggressors broke China's land and sea defense hundreds of times, plunging the Chinese nation into the abysm of calamity, Xi added, calling on the people not to forget the history of humiliation and to build a strong frontier.

June 26 Xi sent congratulations to the African Union on the opening of its 23rd summit.

Unusual for the Premier to meet with a vice president of such a relatively small country. China worried about its oil interests in South Sudan, as evidenced by recent diplomatic efforts in the region.

	July 3	Zhang held talks with Hannes Germann, president of the Council of States of Switzerland's Federal Assembly.

	June 27	Zhang chaired an NPC Standing Committee meeting. Appointed Chen Zhenggao as new Minister of Housing and Urban-Rural Development. Move not a surprise as former minister Jiang Weixin was above retirement age and not appointed to 18 th Central Committee.
		Chen is said to be close to Premier Li, and apparently all about shantytown renovation.
		Zhang presided over a lecture for the NPC Standing Committee on building a fairer and more sustainable social security system.
		Zhang presided over an NPC chairmen's meeting.
		Zhang met with President of Myanmar Thein Sein.
Yu Zhengsheng	July 10	Yu chaired a CPPCC symposium to discuss the South-North Water Diversion Project.
