I think growth will surprise on the upside in H1, but it's hard to see how the government achieves its 6.5% growth target over the 13th Five-Year Plan. Will they try to leverage up to hit the target? If they do, will they be able to succeed in making to 2020 without a crash? And if they do, does all hell break loose post-2020 (or post-2023)?

Maybe they just massage (i.e. fudge) the statistics?

Or maybe they instead admit defeat and just accept lower growth? This would be best outcome, but in a system obsessed with control, led by a leader obsessed with control, it seems unlikely. As I said in a recent piece for the FT's Beyondbrics blog:

"It has become increasingly apparent that Xi Jinping's focus on buttressing Communist Party control is hindering progress on key structural reforms. Xi's anti-corruption campaign has strengthened extra-legal Party disciplinary mechanisms, undermining the rule of law. And his centralization of policymaking has resulted in a state-dominated approach to economic management that is hindering the reforms necessary to rebalance and upgrade the economy. Market-oriented reforms are not entirely off the table, but the overall outlook has deteriorated."
