#### **Glass houses**

After a year in which China's economic management has been summarily criticized, Li Keqiang used his speech to the meeting of G20 Finance Ministers this weekend to offer a pointed rebuke to the world's developed economies. Li said that that quantitative easing has failed, and caused "negative externalities".

In his speech, Li said that China "will expand aggregate demand". It's the latest sign that increased fiscal support is front and center of the economic agenda in 2016.

#### Xi chaired a meeting of the Central Leading Group for Overall Reform.

Said efforts should be focused on raising the number of registered urban residents, providing equal public services for rural and urban dwellers, and making cities more people-friendly.
