Xi Jinping Party General Secretary; PRC President; Chairman of Central Military Commission	July 25	Xi met with Director-General of the World Health Organization Margaret Chan.
	July 23	Xi sent a congratulatory letter for the 100 <sup>th</sup> founding anniversary of the Geological Museum of China.
	July 22	Xi chaired a meeting of the Leading Group for Overall Reform.  Xi called for better supervision of reform efforts, including supervising officials' awareness of reform, and their division of duties and work styles. The meeting also approved a plan for the pilot reform of poverty alleviation in less developed areas by exploring hydroelectric and mineral resources, a guideline for strengthening development of industry associations in cultural sectors, and a pilot reform plan for a system of leniency for suspects who plead guilty.
	July 18- 20	Xi went on an inspection tour to Ningxia Hui Autonomous Region.  Chaired a meeting on poverty alleviation; visited businesses and promoted his new development concepts and stressed need to implement supply-side reforms; visited mosque and said "direct religious figures and believers to respect and abide by the law, resolutely guard against illegal infiltration via religious means, and promote religious and social harmony";
	July 20	Xi sent a written instruction on strengthening flood safety, control and prevention.
